Absences:

If a student is going to be absent, please notify the main office by phone at (902) 368-6950, or leave a message on our safe arrival line by pressing "1". Please give specific symptoms, student's full name and homeroom teacher when notifying the school.

Clothing:

- -In order to reduce the number of lost and unclaimed items, please label your child's clothing.
- -To avoid inconveniencing you by having to drop off dry clothing on those wet/muddy weather days, it would be helpful to pack a change of clothing.

Bussing:

Our busses are filled to capacity; therefore, we will not be able to issue a bus passes for students wishing to travel on a different bus to a friend's house, etc.

Indoor/Outdoor Footwear:

We ask students to continue to have indoor sneakers and outdoor shoes. Also, we recommend that students have outdoor sneakers as their outdoor shoes (not flip flops or sandals). There will be times when teachers may take their lessons outside, particularly the gym classes.

Safety:

We continue to remind students to please use the crosswalk when crossing the street to and from school.

Water Bottles:

Please continue to send a reusable water bottle with students. It is important that students stay hydrated throughout the day when the temperature increases. Please note that juice and milk would be reserved for snack or lunch time. We do not recommend drinks with high sugar or energy content, including caffeinated beverages (i.e. iced coffees).

-A package of forms along with other pieces of correspondence is being sent home with students today. Please sign the forms and return to your child's homeroom teacher as soon as possible.

We look forward to seeing everyone wearing their orange shirts on September 28th.
